# **UWSC COMMUNITY IMPACT INITIATIVES**



#### PROVIDING ACCESS TO HEALING (PATH)

Recognizing the need for youth to access mental health, United Way founded the Providing Access To Healing (PATH) initiative in 2015. PATH students who reported severe anxiety decreased by 25% in a threemonth timeframe.

# COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP FOR CHILDREN (CPC) Recognizing the importance of supporting families during the most critical years of youth development (birth to six), United Way founded the Community Partnership for Children (CPC) in 2016 and acts as the backbone support for this coalition.
