#### DREAM UP! GRANT & CHILD CARE SUPPORTS

Dream Up! Child Care Supply-Building Grant was awarded to CPC to create a sustainable child care supply in Sheboygan County. The grant launched three programs, and the CPC continues to take a leadership role in ongoing child care efforts in our community through ARPA, Healthy Sheboygan County and conversations with key leaders in our community.

#### **EXPANDING PARTNERSHIPS**

On a local level, CPC welcomed several new member agencies and individuals into the coalition, and took on a leadership role in multiple community-wide projects, such as conducting the Child Care Impact Survey and presenting the results in May 2024.



On a state level, CPC strengthened relationships with several statewide organizations/networks, including the Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board, PBS WI Education and Supporting Families Together Association [SFTA]) and assisted in planning state-level efforts including SFTA's Advocacy Day.



#### CONTINUED SUPPORT TO CPC COALITION MEMBERS

CPC's Steering Committee is actively growing and improving ways to support coalition members by offering a variety of informational and educational presenters and finding new methods to connect and elevate their existing programs, including our Month of the Young Child passport and growing Family Fun Fest.

#### **EXPANTION OF YOUTH CRISES & POSTVENTION EFFORTS**

In partnership with Health & Human Services Healthy Sheboygan County and The Wisconsin Department of Justice's Office of School Safety, PATH hosted a Critical Incident Response Training to collectively increase our community's effectiveness, efficiency, and intentional response to continue to keep students safe.

# CHEERS TO 90 YEARS IMPROVING LIVES SINCE 1934

#### 1934 Sheboygan Community Welfare Fund is Established

The campaign lasted one month and the Sheboygan area raised \$48,120.40 for agencies, such as Child Welfare Center, Home of the Friendless, and Salvation Army.

#### Welfare Fund name changes to Sheboygan United Fund

1975 campaign, under the new name, raised \$386,750 awarded to 21 agencies. The average donation was \$18.

#### 2005 Sheboygan & Plymouth United Funds Merge

With the merger of Sheboygan and Plymouth, the fund raises more than \$2 million for the first time in history.

#### Sheboygan Falls Merges to create United Way of Sheboygan County

2012 Sheboygan Falls merged with Sheboygan Area United Way to become the United Way of Sheboygan County.

#### 2015 Providing Access To Healing (PATH) Begins

This school-based mental health program is launched to increase access to services for youth by removing financial and geographical barriers.

#### 2015 Community Partnership for Children (CPC) Begins

CPC is the backbone support for a coalition of over 20 youth-serving agencies in Sheboygan County, all focusing on education, child care and resources for families with children aged birth to six years.

#### 2020 COVID-19 Relief Fund distributes \$285,176 to local agencies

UWSC established Sheboygan County COVID-19 Relief Fund for the nonprofit sector in March 2020 to provide short-term grants. The Sheboygan Service Club joined the efforts to continue this work and together raised a total of \$285,176 awarded to 32 local agencies.

To help encourage meeting the goal, Jeff Gentine (left), vice president of business operations and Jeff Giffin, president, vowed to dye their hair green if a \$10,000 target was reached through employee donations. The employees raised \$10,095.65 and out came the green hairspray.

The corporation matched the employee donation 100 percent, with a final donation of over \$20,000. This is up from 2005's donation of \$3,990, the first year of the
